CHICAGO

Chicago is a vibrant city with many things to do for all ages. Here are a few things to do while you enjoy your stay in The Windy City.



NAVY PIER

Originally named Municipal Pier No. 2, Navy Pier was the first of its kind to combine the business of shipping with the pleasure of public entertainment. The 292-foot-wide Pier, 'built by the city for the people,' is the largest in the world, projecting east 3,040 feet into Lake Michigan. It remains the longest public pier in the world today.



MILLENNIUM PARK

Discover a state-of-the-art collection of architecture, landscape design, and art that provide the backdrop for hundreds of free cultural programs including concerts, exhibitions, tours, and family activities. In Millennium Park, you'll find a new kind of town square – a lively, spectacular gathering spot located in the heart of the city and a destination for Chicagoans and visitors alike.



THE MUSEUMS

Chicago is home to 56 museums. In fact, there's even a "Museum Campus" along Lake Michigan that hosts some of the big players like The Shedd Aquarium, The Adler Planetarium, and The Field Museum. Other notable museums around town include The Art Institute of Chicago, The Chicago History Museum, The Museum of Science and Industry, and The Museum of Contenporary Art.

THE SKYDECK AT WILLIS TOWER

Originally named The Sears Tower, the newly renamed Willis Tower is the tallest building in the Western Hemisphere. At 1,353 feet in the air, the Sky-Ledge's glass boxes extend out 4.3 feet from the Skydeck, allowing visitors to see as far as four states away, not to mention the beautiful city of Chicago from a truly unique perspective.



GARFIELD PARK CONSERVATORY

Chicago's Garfield Park Conservatory is one of the largest and most stunning botanical conservatories in the nation. Often referred to as "landscape art under glass," the Conservatory showcases thousands of plant species from around the world throughout eight indoor display gardens. Year-round, visitors can enjoy the lush flora and tropical temperatures indoors, or more than 10 acres of outdoor gardens, nature play spaces for children, water lily pond, and much more.



THE LINCOLN PARK ZOO

Founded in 1868, the Lincoln Park Zoo is among the oldest zoos in North America. It is also one of a few free admission zoos in the United States. The Lincoln Park Zoo houses over 1,100 animals from some 200 species, including polar bears, lions, penguins, reptiles, monkeys, and more. Also located in Lincoln Park Zoo is a burr oak tree which dates to 1830, three years before the city of Chicago was founded.
